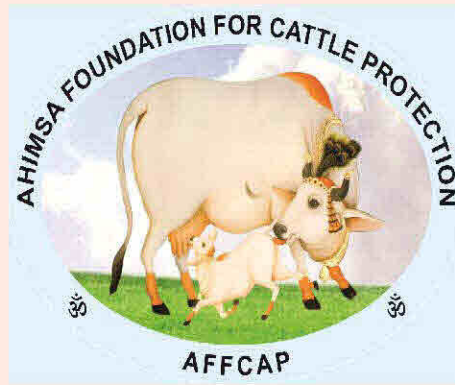

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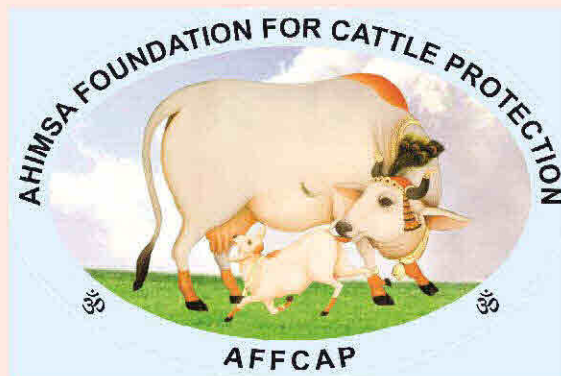

This issue's highlighted gaushala is the Govardhan Eco-Village which is situated after a two hour drive north of Mumbai, Maharashtra.

Govardhan Eco Village (GEV) has bagged the Asian Leadership Corporate Social Responsibility(CSR) award for "Best Overall Sustainable Performance". The award was presented by Dr R.L. Bhatia, Founder of World CSR Day and by Mr Rahul Kanodia, CEO of Datamatics Global Services and was received by Mr. Rasamrita Das on behalf of Govardhan Eco Village.

The Eco-Village protected herd totals 75 animals and are comprised of mostly purebred Tharparkars and Gheer Desi breeds. Their commitment to a sustainable future is highly visible based and stems from a commitment to A.C. Bhaktivedants Swami's teaching of Simple Living, High Thinking.

Food Habits of a Nation provides a revealing view into India's current choice of foodstuffs. Historically, India has been viewed as an unassailable bastion of vegetarianism, but the study reveals that currently only 31% of Indians is dedicated to a vegetarian fare.

Consumption by state ranges from two percent in Kerala to the highest in Rajasthan of 63%. States situated near oceans tend to have the lowest commitment to vegetarianism due to the availability of seafood.

An article found in the Times of India discloses Maneka Gandhi's account of the social nature of the largest slaughterhouse, the Deonar Abattoir of Mumbai. It is a slaughterhouse dedicated to butchering 4000 animals daily and should be an impetus to move back to a vegetable garden.
